NEW BUSINESS

1. Organizers, Coordinators and assistants are needed for Wednesday Coffee, Friday and Saturday Potlucks, and Special Events! Many volunteers will help you! - 2. Friday Potlucks are scheduled for: November 5 and 19; December 3 and 17
- 3. Themed Potluck dates: **Oktoberfest Potluck** (**October 8**; Ann Archer and Margarete Dittmann, coordinators): this is a special German festival fare dinner; **Christmas Potluck** (**December 11**; Ann Archer and Margarete Dittmann, coordinators): more details forthcoming.
- 4. Reports on Special Events: Chicken Dinner (August 14; Patty Schneider, organizer): 102 people attended; income (\$390.90) from this event went to Wild Bird Charity in Blaine; the entire amount of the 50/50 draw (\$475) went for school supplies in Blaine; End of Summer BBQ (September 4; CoCo Giacolino, Lot #315 organizer): more than 75 attended before sold out; a profit of \$73.08 was deposited to the Activities fund. CoCo stated that she would like to organize this event again next year; it is a very good opportunity for people to get together; her work crew wore masks and gloves; they handled all of the food that was sold.
- 5. Special Events: on behalf of Adeline Decker, Isabella Matthews asked that we reserve the Clubhouse for a Halloween Party on October 23 between 2:00 to 5:00 p.m. Activities policy is that "an organizer or coordinator must be present at an Activities meeting or communicate in writing to propose a Latitude 49 Activity." Isabella indicated that Adeline understood this; she will provide information to us for this event as soon as possible but wanted to make us aware of it.
- 6. Other: CoCo Giacolino stated that she does not recommend Charity giving for School Supplies in Blaine. When the cash gift was brought to the school, it was not only not received very positively but also did not appear to be able to provide children with the supplies nor other personal necessities, e.g., shoes.
- 7. Charitable Giving: Item #6 led to a discussion regarding local Charities who would be significantly assisted with cash or items gifted to them: a) Blaine Clothing Bank (men's clothing, linens, socks, hats, et al.); Coat Drive in Blaine (coats, scarves, gloves, mittens, hats, socks et al); Blaine Food Bank (cash and food drives); Blaine Senior Center (cash to support their mission programs, e.g., MOW Food Distribution). All of these and more Charity giving possibilities of Community Assistance Programs are listed weekly in the Northern Light (see "Ongoing" section under "Coming Up").
