OLD BUSINESS

- 2. Treasurer's Report: the WECU checking account current balance is \$2923.06.
- 3. Friday Potlucks are scheduled for **September 15**, **22** and **29**.
- 4. Reports on Special Events: An Evening with Elvis Dinner Dance, August 12 (Cory McMullin and Nancy Gordon, organizers): this was a sold out Special Event that was very successful; after expenses, a gift of \$265.77 was sent to the Whatcom Humane Society; in their report, Nancy and Cory wrote that more volunteers on subcommittees for preparation and clean up would be helpful; Nancy LaQua suggested that for organizers who would like more assistance, a notice such as "volunteers are needed" could be placed on the advertising posters; the complete report will be filed in the Activities Resource Book 🌻 Annual Garage, Craft and Bake Sale, August 19 (Rachel Allen, coordinator): volunteers handed out maps to 234 cars this year; 50 lot residents participated; Helen indicated that the Bake Sale made a profit of \$255.00; she has determined that next year, she will cut and package individual slices of appropriate baked goods that are donated 🏶 Fudge Kitchen Demo Class, August 23 (Bev Bott, coordinator): fifteen attendees enjoyed sampling fudge and then seeing how Bev made it; door prizes were also given; this was a very successful first time event!; Bev gifted all of the prizes and fudge for this Activity; she expressed the hope that others in the Park will pick up this Kitchen Demo idea for their special culinary dish **End of Summer BBQ, September 2** (CoCo Giacolino, organizer): CoCo reported that 106 attended this very successful Special Event; because "leftovers" from the Birthday Burger Bashes and Elvis Dinner Dance Special Events were able to be used, the profit was \$243.07 this year; the complete report will be filed in the Activities Resource Book # A Latitude 49 Parade, September 2 (Mary Lang, organizer): Mary indicated that this Special Event was a lot of fun again this year with 13 golf carts and 3 youth bicycles participating; Theresa, one of the judges for the entries, posed several suggestions for prizes in the future; there was a lengthy discussion regarding the timing between the **Parade** and the End of Summer BBQ.
